- made a small change to the Travel Policy
- awarded Robinson Civil Group a contract to provide Plant Hire for our Disaster Recovery works, and Orion Project Consulting were awarded a contract to manage the project.
- approved a change to the Organisational Structure, adding a new Business Development Manager position.



## Jeans for Genes

## August started with Jeans for Genes' 100 skips a day.

For the first week, our numbers were good, but now it is just 3 or 4 of us skipping it out.

Our temporary airport came to life earlier this month, with all the fencing, windsock, temporary office, generator, airstrip lighting and toilet block all installed in a week.

It was operational for the first flight on Monday, 11 August, when two planes had landed on the temporary strip by 9.30am and one had departed.

It was great to talk with the pilots, who were impressed.

That night, we also had an RFDS evacuation, so everything was tested and a proven success on the very first day.

Works have since begun on our airstrip upgrade, with sand from the beachside of the airstrip ready to build a new foundation for the edges to raise the strip 300mm.

The widening of the airstrip will include a parallel dirt strip, which will allow planes to land if the bitumen strip is ever compromised.

Planning is on the way for six extensions to social houses, four granny flats and two new subdivisions — one to the north and one to the south.

Works are continuing with re-sheeting started on the Kowanyama Road, which is now graded all the way to the Coleman River.

Cairns Hardware brought out some Makita sales reps so we could see some of the new batteryoperated tools they have to offer.

We also had Tropical Vets come in for another successful vet visit.

Grant and Contract Manager Graham Poon also visited to discuss our teams' future needs, so grants opportunities can be identified.

A big thank you to Geoff Scott, Sharon Marshall's partner, who volunteered at the Admin Store while in Pormpuraaw for a visit — I am glad you enjoyed the fishing.

Our end-of-year audit is now completed, and we



will be signing off on that with the Audit Committee on Tuesday, 2 September 2025.

A big thank you to the Cairns' Finance Team for putting in 110% again this year to complete our audit within the agreed time frames, and without any audit issues being raised.

Council has also entered into several new and recurring funding agreements.

I have spent a good amount of time exploring new software opportunities as we move into less paper-based processes and lead our Council with more productive software products.
