As nine Aboriginal Councils, including Pormpuraaw, celebrated their 40th birthdays on Sunday 30 March, the current Mayors and Councillors - including Pormpuraaw - were in Cairns this month to attend the Crisafulli government's Community Cabinet meeting.

The Aboriginal Advisory Council in 1974 - 51 years ago - was a precursor to elected local council, many of those Chairmen went on to be the elected mayors of their communities.

On 30 March 1985, the Edward River community elected five councillors to constitute an autonomous Edward River Aboriginal Council established under the Community Services (Aborigines) Act 1984.

On 23 July 1987, the Council area, previously an Aboriginal reserve held by the Queensland Government, was transferred to the trusteeship of the Council under a Deed of Grant in Trust. Also in 1987, the community changed its name to



Pormpuraaw, taken from a local dreamtime story.

On 1 January 2005, under the Local Government (Community Government Areas) Act 2004, Pormpuraaw Aboriginal Council became the Pormpuraaw Aboriginal Shire Council.

This month the Pormpuraaw Aboriginal Shire Council:

- approved one permission to reside in Pormpuraaw.
- approved amendments to the Plant & Equipment to use savings from other Vehicles and Equipment to purchase an additional vehicle.
- approved the purchase of a new Garbage Truck and to increase the budget allocation - the new truck should arrive by April/May.
- approved a change to the April 2025 Council Meeting as it clashed with other meetings.

The next council meeting will be on Wednesday 16 April, 2025.

Another month has passed, and the first quarter of the year has already gone, which means over the next few weeks we will be busy with our quarterly updates to funding bodies, CEO Janelle Menzies writes...

Earlier in the month we had five of our Cairns Office staff join us in Pormpuraaw for a "Getting to Know You and Wellbeing Forum".

About 60 of our employees were split into seven teams — all with people we don't usually work with — and engaged in various things aimed at finding out a bit more about each other.

For one of those tasks we were issued 'Trademutt' Shirts and after a BBQ lunch, we set off in our teams to participate in "Improving our Standards".

This meant each team leader picked somewhere that needed to be tidied up and started the process with a WHS briefing for hazards etc as each person was given a task to complete.

We took before and after photos and made these our new standards.

We will continue these activities each time staff from the Cairns Office Visit.



Also this month Mayor Ralph Kendall was invited to a Community Cabinet meeting in Cairns with the Mayors from Indigenous Councils across the state. It was an opportunity for him to meet with State Ministers and to promote the Torres and Cape Indigenous Council Alliance (TCICA) advocacy documents — which we are a member of — as well as advocate for our own community priorities.

We are about to submit funding applications for two resilience projects for Pormpuraaw.

They are flood cameras for the Lucin and Coleman Rivers on the Strathgordon Road which will enable the community to access footage of river heights

before travelling to Musgrave Station; and to fully enclose and air condition the community hall so we have a comfortable place of refuge as required, particularly in a disaster event.

Conversations with Queensland Housing regarding the construction of a new subdivision are ongoing.

Some of you may have seen signs at either end of Raaku and Manth Streets proposing the developments.

We are also talking with them about additional housing and possible granny flats.

Council and Management are working on the best way to deliver these projects.



As we are at the beginning of the budget preparation process for 2025/26 we are working on what we do to make Pormpuraaw a better place to live.

Community consultation for the design of a new Sports & Recreation precinct near the football oval will be underway soon.

We are looking forward to the fishing competition, Easter and the ANZAC public holidays coming up in April.

Rangers meet in Cairns

Key achievements celebrated at the Western Cape Turtle Threat Abatement Alliance's (WCTTAA) annual post-nesting season meeting in Cairns last month included the monitoring of nearly 4000 turtle nests and the removal of more than 4500 feral pigs.



The meeting brought together 50 representatives from six ranger groups and state and federal government agencies; along with other organisations, stakeholders and contractors committed to turtle conservation and feral pest management.

> Pormpuraaw Land & Sea Ranger Kiren Tarpencha said it was fantastic to hear feedback from each ranger group about the WCTTAA program. "We've heard from other groups, how they're doing and how their programs run differently or similar to ours," he said.

"At the end of the day, we're all doing the same job, but there's a bit of difference between the groups."
